AN INVITATION FROM BISHOP CLAIRE BURKAT, SEPA SYNOD: LUTHERANS, CATHOLICS TO MARK REFORMATION ANNIVERSARY

Lutherans and Catholics will mark the **500th Anniversary of the Reformation** with an ecumenical seminar and worship on **Saturday, October 21**, from **9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m.** at **Trinity Lutheran Church in Lansdale**.

The event – 1517-2017, From Conflict to Communion—Together in Hope – features a seminar highlighting the common commemoration between Lutherans and Catholics for this anniversary. The Rev. Donald McCoid, bishop emeritus of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod, and Dr. John Borelli of Georgetown University will lift up the significant theological progress promoting recent movement toward unity in Christ between Lutherans and Catholics.

Bishop Emeritus McCoid served as the Executive for Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Relations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) from 2008-2016. He served as the Bishop of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod from 1987 until 2007.

A renowned Catholic theologian, **Dr. Borelli** is Special Assistant for Catholic Identity and Dialogue to President John J. DeGioia of Georgetown University. He is also the Coordinator for Dialogue and Relations for the Jesuit Conference of the United States and Canada.

After lunch we will worship together following the Service of Repentance and Reconciliation held in October 2016 led by Pope Francis and Bishop Munib Younan President of the Lutheran World Federation in Lund Sweden.

The Rev Dr. Peter Donahue, President of Villanova Univerity and an Augustinian priest (like Martin Luther) will be the preacher. Bishop Claire Burkat will be the liturgist, along with lay and clergy participants.






Blessing of the Animals

Soli Deo Gloria: 500 Years of Lutheran Music October 29, 4:00 p.m.

As part of our Reformation 500 celebration St. John's hosts Michael Krentz, Dean of the Chapel at United Lutheran Seminary (Philadelphia Campus) who will lead the concert of music for organ, brass, choir and congregation. The program will be in the form of a Lutheran "organ mass," exploring the great hymns of the Lutheran tradition that allowed the congregation to be full participants in the mass. The program will include works by Dietrich Buxtehude, J. S. Bach, and Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, plus contemporary composers, with commentary on the Lutheran tradition of singing and organ music.

Michael Krentz is Dean of the Chapel at United Lutheran Seminary (Philadelphia Campus), and Director of Music/Organist at Christ Lutheran Church in Allentown, Pennsylvania. He holds the Bachelor, Master, and Doctor of Music Degrees in Organ and Church Music from Northwestern University. Dr. Krentz is currently serving as Secretary/Treasurer of The Association of Lutheran Church Musicians; previously he has served as one of ALCM's regional presidents. He is a past-Dean of the Lehigh Valley Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Dr. Krentz lives in Saucon Valley Township with his wife, Linda, where he also enjoys coaching high school tennis.

Following the concert a gala reception featuring fall treats and "Katie's Brew" and "Heavenly Indulgences" from Iron Hill Brewery will be hosted by our Fellowship Committee.

Celebrating the Reformation at St. John's

The year 2017 marks 500 years since a stubborn monk and towering thinker, Martin Luther, published his 95 theses or complaints against the Catholic Church and launched the Protestant Reformation, a momentous religious revolution that changed the world. We are celebrating this anniversary with enthusiasm as a time to remember and be renewed in the freedom of the Gospel.



October Reformation Month at Iron Hill Brew Pub

Iron Hill is brewing two special Reformation beers: Katie's Brew (Martin Luther's wife was famous for her beer), and Heavenly Indulgence (the Catholic practice that set the whole thing off to begin with.) These special Reformation brews will be released on October 11th just in time for the first of five Give 20 events at the pub. On these days 20% of Iron Hill's proceeds from the sale of food will be given to the **Code Blue Shelter** located at Ann's Heart in the former Sacred Heart Church. In order for Code Blue to receive the donation, a Give 20 coupon must be presented to your server.

The five Give 20 days are: **OCTOBER 11**, hosted by St. Peter's Episcopal Church; **OCTOBER 16**, hosted by St. John's Lutheran Church; **OCTOBER 23**, hosted by St. Ann Roman Catholic Church; **OCTOBER 25**, hosted by Parkside United Church of Christ; **and OCTOBER 30**, hosted by the Code Blue Shelter.

Coupons are available in our office, on the kiosk in the Narthex, as well as in the bulletin. All five days are listed on the coupon so if you can't make the day St. John's hosts you are welcome to participate on any or all of the other four days; however, the coupon is needed for each day.

Sunday, October 22 Movie—Martin Luther: The Idea that Changed the World at the Phoenixville Colonial Theater at 3:30 p.m.

Martin Luther triggered a seismic upheaval that rocked the western world in the 1500s—with an impact that continues to reverberate to this day. This film tells the great adventure story of his life. At the same time, it examines his quest for truth—questions we all must face—including "Who am I?" "What is my purpose" and "How do I get right with God?" Following the movie you are invited to join in a discussion in the Colonial's new party room. Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$8 for students and 62+, \$6 for children under 13. Tickets will be available at St. John's beginning September 24th. There are only 170 seats, so get your tickets early.

Sunday, October 29—Reformation Sunday School 9:30 to 10:30 a.m.

All sorts of activities are being planned: a movie, cookie decorating, coloring pages, a skit, quiz bowl, a special German coffee hour and hammering one of the 95 Theses on a door. Children, youth and adults will move from "station" for this intergenerational learning experience.



Now, a little bit about Debbie...


She has been a Lutheran all her life, initially Missouri Synod, and a member of Messiah Lutheran Church in Dowingtown for twenty years where she has been involved in

hood. It was founded in 1887 as the private estate of siblings John and Lydia T. Morris. The arboretum was established in 1932 as a university-administered arboretum and public garden for research, education and horticultural display. It became the official Arboretum of the Commonwealth in 1988. The Morris Arboretum treats visitors to an ever-changing display of rare and beautiful plants and trees all year long and is stunning in the fall. It is a place of big trees, a place of beauty, a historic landscape, a scientific institution, a teaching garden, a place of art and architecture, and a place of peace and healing.

Electronic Giving Options Available

And when travel, illness or other circumstances prevent you from attending services, electronic giving will allow your weekly offerings to continue on an uninterrupted basis. So, how can you provide continued financial support to St. John's ministries when you are away?


The new options are in addition to the Simply Giving program which many of you may already be using. These new options will allow you to set up a recurring gift using your personal credit card or bank account. You also have the option to provide a one-time gift to the ongoing ministries, flowers, bulletins, memorial gifts, and disaster relief.

You may have noted this QR code published in the weekly bulletin. Using your smartphone to scan the code, it will take you directly to the web page for your convenience. If you wish, it will allow you to create an account for recurring or ongoing gifts that you can then access from your phone or from your home computer. Can you access this while at St John's? Yes! Just look for the StJohns Guest WIFI on your smartphone.

You can download the app to your smart phone for routine access. Search for "Give+" in the app store. Once installed, search for "St John's Lutheran Church." There are many to choose from, so make sure you find St John's in Phoenixville. This application looks and works the same as the web page that can be accessed from our normal internet web page at stjohnluthphoenixville.org. Then click on the "Donate Now" link on the top right side of the page.



One lesser-known benefit of electronic giving is its positive impact on the environment. An enormous amount of natural resources are consumed in the production, transportation, processing and disposal of paper checks. That's why paying bills electronically always ranks high on any list of actions an individual can take to improve the environment. The trend toward electronic payments has already produced more than a 50% decline in check use since the year 2000. As you consider the payment method you use to make your regular offering, we hope that you will think about the unique connection between financial stewardship and environmental stewardship.
