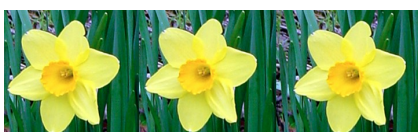

## Palm-Passion Weekend

Saturday, March 24<sup>th</sup> – Evening Light, 5 p.m.

Sunday, March 25<sup>th</sup>

Holy Communion, 8 a.m. and 10:45 a.m.  
Christian Education, 9:30 a.m.

This weekend's worship begins with a parade and shouts of Hosanna! But then the Gospel takes us to the cross of Good Friday. Our seminarian, Debbie Gordon, serves as our preacher at Evening Light. On Sunday morning our ninth grade confirmation class will present the Passion of our Lord according to the Gospel of Mark. Come to sing both "Hosanna!" and "Lord, have mercy upon us."

## Maundy Thursday, March 29<sup>th</sup>

Holy Communion, 12:15 and 7:30 p.m.

This Thursday is called "Maundy," which means "command," from the verse in John's gospel in which Jesus commands us to love one another as he loved us. At this service, you may come forward for individual forgiveness. We hear about the Passover lamb, Jesus' last meal with his disciples before his death, and Jesus washing his disciples' feet. At our 7:30 p.m. service you are invited to have your feet washed and then to wash the feet of another worshiper. Finally we strip the chancel bare, to ready ourselves for Good Friday.

## Good Friday, March 30<sup>th</sup>

Tenebrae, 12:15 and 7:30 p.m.

Why do we call this day "good"? In John's telling of Jesus' passion, Jesus is "I AM," the God who reigns from the cross, the king who discusses theology with Pilate. Listen for the differences between John's passion and Matthew's passion that we heard on Sunday. At the cross, our old life of captivity to sin is finished, and our new life of discipleship begins.

## Holy Saturday, March 31<sup>st</sup>

Easter Vigil, 7 p.m.

The Great Vigil of Easter begins with fire and ends with Alleluias! In between we experience God's saving acts through words of scripture, the joyous splashing of water in Baptism, the wonder of resurrection, and a life-giving Easter Feast. Don't miss it!

## Easter Sunday, April 1<sup>st</sup>

Holy Communion, 8 and 10:45 a.m.

Easter Breakfast, 9 to 10:30 a.m.

On this day the Lord has acted! On the first day of the week God began creation, transforming darkness into light. On this, the "eighth day" of the week, Jesus Christ was raised from the dead. We celebrate this new creation in the feast of victory. With great joy we celebrate this day of days, even as we begin the great fifty days of Easter. Filled with hope, we go forth to share the news that Christ is risen!

## The Pastor's Message:

Holy Week invites us to enter into mystery and therein discover love beyond all our expectations.

On Sunday, March 25<sup>th</sup> we begin with a parade—shouting hosanna and waving palm branches as the Messiah is welcomed into the city. (In some ways quite similar to the recent parade featuring the Eagles, for while they were the under-dogs, so was Jesus.) There is such joy. But then very quickly we are drawn into the inevitable passion of our Lord. This year we'll hear Mark's version as our ninth grade confirmation students take on the roles of Jesus, his disciples, the high priests, Pilate and others. We are there when they crucify our Lord—an innocent one killed like so many innocent ones then and now. Nothing separates us from God—not even death.

On Thursday, March 29<sup>th</sup>, we are invited to Jesus' last supper with his disciples at 12:15 p.m. and later at 7:30 p.m. At the table we hear his words, "this is my body," "this is my blood," take and eat, do this remembering me. Our evening worship includes the washing of feet, just as it did in the upper room where Jesus and his disciples gathered all those years ago. The first time I experienced the washing of feet, it made me feel vulnerable and deeply loved, both at the same time. I "got" why Jesus insisted on taking the role of a servant and washing his disciples' feet in spite of Peter's protest. If you have been shy about participating in loved-filled act, I encourage you to try it this year.

Friday, March 30<sup>th</sup> at 12:15 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. we hear the Passion of Christ—this time from the Gospel of John. Listen for the differences from Sunday's reading and discover a Christ who is "in charge," fully giving himself up as a sacrifice to sin and death in order to defy the power of both. The mystery deepens, ending in darkness.

On Saturday, March 31<sup>st</sup> at 7 p.m. (not quite dark, but almost) we begin with fire! Fire to break the power of darkness, fire to light the Paschal (Christ) Candle and to be carried into the world. From fire, we tell and hear ancient stories of God's actions through the ages and know that God continues to act today. Then there will be baptisms!!! Lots of water blessed by the Spirit!!! Joy abounding as three children of God are reborn. And finally, the EASTER feast where heaven touches earth in new life, new hope, new peace. (For planning purposes, last year the Vigil was about 90 minutes. It is intentionally child-friendly.)

On Easter Sunday, April 1<sup>st</sup>, worship at 8 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. begin with shouts of "Alleluia, Christ is risen, risen indeed!" Then there's amazing good news, carols of praise, a victory feast and endless hope. It's April Fool's Day this year—how appropriate, for God's love and grace always has the last laugh!!!! There's a scrumptious Easter breakfast beginning at 9 a.m. to which everyone is invited.

## Lions and tigers and bears . . .

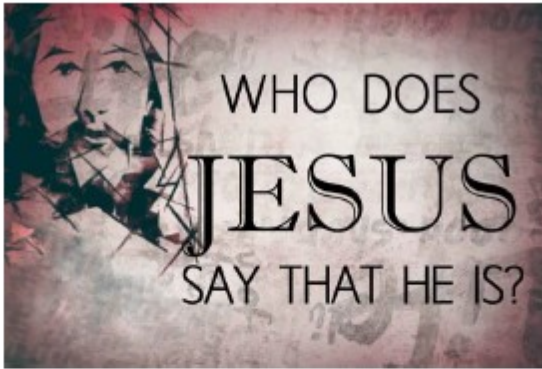

What started out 20+ years ago as a small, rural town hospital has grown into the Selian Lutheran Medical Center ([www.selianlh.habari.co.tz](http://www.selianlh.habari.co.tz)), plus the new urban Arusha Lutheran Medical Center (ALMC) ([www.almc.habari.co.tz](http://www.almc.habari.co.tz)) was added in the past few years.

Because of our continued support, the ALMC has now been able to include a dialysis unit, add to the Newborn Intensive Care Unit (the pride of the nation), and the ALMC School of Nursing continues to graduate nurses. As you know, every year St. John's supports five Maasai Girls from that region with their education. The sharing, giving and growing in God's love continues in many ways, in some of the most remote places, with truly life-saving accomplishments.

As in the past, St. John's special Lent offering will be dedicated to the Jacobson's ministry to enhance their efforts in Tanzania. Some of the accomplishments achieved by your past Lent offerings include enlarging the Plaster House surgery center, planning a new clinic in Juba, South Sudan and assisting the Kilimanjaro Christina Medical Center start a zonal Cancer Care Center. #### Registration Information:

Pre registration is encourage and appreciated. A registration link will be mailed out on Feb 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Every youth attending must have a completed permission form signed by a parent or guardian, and a sponsor sheet to hand in on day of event. The sponsor checks should be written out to "Ministries at Main Street Shelter", cash is acceptable. Supplies are also accepted – please visit the website below for a list of needed shelter supplies. There must be a minimum of (1) Adult for every (7) youth participating in the event and they must be gender specific to your group. Please note: St. James will be providing additional chaperones to monitor the Box City event, but your congregation is required to have their own chaperone ratio. Registration opens February 3<sup>rd</sup> and closes February 28, 2017. Registration during this timeframe includes an event tshirt per participant. Registration after this may be accepted, but may not include an event tshirt.

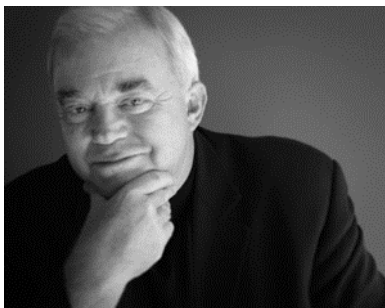

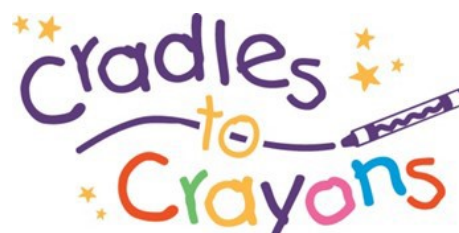
