Growing Up is Hard to Do . . . For All of Us!

Recently I asked a friend how his family was doing. He replied that his 12 yeaold son was retreating into his cell phone and while sometimes he could see the boy he was, there was increasing distance and "attitude." We went on to talk about how hard growing up can be and how, when overwhelmed, sometimes children and teens (and dare I add adults too) retreat from the challenge. I shared with him how mission projects have helped our children, youth and adults to step out of their "comfort zone" and create a climate for amazing growth. Over the years I've notice that's true whether it's 5th graders working as VBS assistants, 9th graders preparing and serving dinner for Feast Incarnate in West Philly, high schoolers learning how to hang sheet-rock as Dylan and Max are doing in this picture, or adults on a hospice visit in an Tanzanian village. When risks are taken, defensives come down, the Holy Spirit has room to work and wondrous things happen!

Every year, the St. John's Angel Tree is the way we raise scholar-ship money for the five "St. John's Girls" we support at the school. We have been providing scholarships for twelve years. Fifteen to twenty young women have received the gift of an excellent high school education. All of them have graduated with some going on to college to become teachers, nurses, accountants, or physical therapists. Educating the women of a village raises the standard of living for the whole village.

We will make Christmas ornaments with age-appropriate projects for children and teens. Our ornament making session will be led by Kelly LeMarbe who is coordinating the Angel Tree project. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to participate.

You can help by making ornaments and donating hand-made objects for the table under our Angel Tree to be sold. Monetary donations are also needed—perhaps a full or partial scholarship. \$85 per month or \$1,000 per year provides a young woman with a full year's room, board, fees, books, supplies and uniform, giving her an education she would otherwise not receive. 
Offering will be directed to the Phoenixville Clergy Association Emergency Fund and food donations will also be received for the PACS Food Bank for our neighbors in need.

At My Church....

In our September meeting, the Welcoming Team discussed a blog post published in *Living Lutheran* on June 22, 2016 titled, "Why we will no longer be a welcoming church" by Rob Moss. Though the title of the post is provocative, and a bit tongue in cheek, it made an important point about the difference between a "welcoming" church and an "inviting" church. Moss states, "Welcoming, from a missional perspective is passive. It denotes waiting for visitors and guests to drop by. Inviting is different. Inviting is active. Being an inviting church means that we leave the comfort of Sunday morning worship and seek out our neighbors. Being an inviting church starts with who God has called us to be as church and mandates joining God at work in the world."

Being an "inviting" church can be very scary, especially if you are an introvert, or are uncomfortable discussing your faith outside the walls of the church. But Moss suggests that practicing small asks or invites with our friends, neighbors or colleagues every week will eventually make the task easier.

The Welcoming Team felt that, while we as a congregation are very good at welcoming people, maybe we need a little practice when it comes to inviting. With that in mind, we developed a list of suggestions and are challenging members of St. John's to use them to make at least one invitation a week to flex our "inviting" muscle. Just like any exercise, it will become easier the more frequently and faithfully we practice. Here are our suggestions:

Week of October 21st – "My church is holding a Halloween Trunk or Treat next Sunday, October 28th from 2 to 3:30 p.m."

Week of October 28th – "My church supports the PACS Food Bank and especially Empty Bowls being held on Friday, November 2nd from 5 to 8 at TCHS-Pickering."

Week of November 4th – "My church has a "come as you are" worship service every Saturday evening that begins at 5 p.m."

Week of November 11th – "The youth and adults at my church go on summer mission trips. Last year they went to Kentucky through the Appalachian Service Project."

First Communion Class Beginning

When children are baptized parents, godparents and the whole congregation promise to raise them in the faith and specifically to bring them to the table of grace—Holy Communion. Some of our children receive Holy Communion when they are quite young. Others do so after a period of instruction that is provided in fifth grade. Both those who have been receiving the sacrament and those who look forward to doing so are invited to participate in First Holy Communion instruction during the month of November.

On Sundays, November 4th, 11th and 18th, Kate DeMutis will be leading our First Holy Communion class from 9:25 to 10:25 a.m. in the "red room" in our downstairs Sunday school hall.
