Fourth Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, July 6th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, July 7th—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. In the gospel reading for this weekend, Jesus sends out seventy disciples to spread the word of salvation. Come to worship to hear the story, gather at the feet of Jesus, and then be sent out as an emissary for Christ in your daily life! Whom do you know that is hungry for good news?

Fifth Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, July 13th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, July 14^{th} —Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. This weekend's gospel reading is the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Come to worship to consider this story again and to pray that we ourselves will embody such mercy. The bread and wine of the table will strengthen you for such a life.

Sixth Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, July 20th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, July 21st—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. In our first reading for this weekend the Lord visits Abraham and Sarah to tell them that the long-awaited promise of the birth of a child will be fulfilled for them in their old age. Come and hear this wonderful text from Genesis in story form.

Seventh Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, July 27th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, July 28th—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. Persistence in prayer evoked the admiration of Jesus and wins the attention of the Lord when Abraham intercedes for Sodom. The life of the baptized—to be rooted and built up in Christ Jesus the Lord—is to be rooted in prayer. So how do you pray? What do say? Can you hear God's response?

Eighth Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, August 3rd—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, August 4th—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. So what is the cost of being rich? In our Gospel this week a rich man has such successful harvests that he must build bigger and bigger barns to store all his stuff. Come to worship to receive a very different kind of treasure in community, word, and sacrament and be rich in everything that really matters.



Ninth Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, August 10th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, August 11th—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. Jesus says, "It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." It is God's promise from the beginning—to Abraham, to the early church, and to the "little flock" of which we are a part today in assembly. Faith, God's baptismal gift, trusts the promises of God. Have no fear.

Tenth Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, August 17th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, August 18th—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. The gospel for this weekend is surprisingly harsh: being a believer brings not peace, but dissension. Come to worship to hear about this; come to pray. The bread and wine will strengthen us for our future, no matter what comes.

Eleventh Weekend after Pentecost

Saturday, August 24th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m.

Sunday, August 25th—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m. Remember the sabbath day. Call the sabbath a delight. This is the Lord's day, and the Lord will do for us what the Lord does: feed us, forgive us, help and heal us. Rejoice at all the wonderful things God is doing.

Twelfth Weekend after Pentecost Labor Day Weekend

Saturday, August 31th—Evening Light at 5:00 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 1st—Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m.

Invited and inviting—that is the nature of the Church. By God's grace in holy baptism we have a place at the banquet table of the Lord. When, by the power of that same Spirit, humility and mutual love continue among us, the Church can be more inviting still.

On September 8th we begin a new season of faith formation along with a new Sunday morning schedule. Such was the experience of the followers of Jesus on the first Pentecost Sunday of the Church and of our seven confirmation students as they shared their faith statements. Bible Verse: Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Hebrews 11:1



Kimberly Rutherford graduated from Lycoming College with a degree in History and Secondary Education, and was a four-year starter for lacrosse while attending college.


Masters and Doctoral Graduates

New Communion Procedures

Communion practices vary from church to church and as part of strengthening worship, we will be making a small adjustment to our Sunday morning communion procedure. It can best be described as "walking continuous communion." Communicants will walk to the front using the side aisles (as we have been doing), pick up a glass from the tray, and meet the pastor and communion assistant or the assisting minister and communion assistant in front of the communion rail to receive the bread and wine before putting the used glass in the tray and returning to their seat using the center aisle. You are welcome to kneel at the rail for a moment of prayer after receiving the communion elements. This new method should provide a continuous line of people receiving the Lord's Supper. The Evening Light communion procedure will not change.

Strategic Planning - June 2019 Update

This update focuses on three of the Strategic Planning Teams:

- 1. Strengthening Worship
- 2. Youth
- 3. Christian Education--Children, Youth and Families

Strengthening Worship Team:

Below is a synopsis of concerns presented and actions already taken by the Strengthening Worship Team.

Congregational Feedback/Concerns

As the result of a combined meeting of Christian Education and Worship & Music Committees and an action taken by Council, a new worship schedule will be adopted in fall 2019 moving to 8:30-9:00 a.m. Coffee and Fellowship, 9-10 Christian Education, and a single service at 10:15 a.m.

Service length has been addressed by reading fewer lessons, alternating gathering hymn with hymn of praise (either/or, not both), a new means for continuous distribution of communion

Increased use of more contemporary hymnody from sources other than the ELW

Attention to liveliness and vibrancy of hymnody

Inclusion of instrumental accompaniments for service music and opportunity offered for additional participation

Addition of new voices to Worship & Music Committee

Story sermons to help engage the children in worship

Inter-generational elements of the service as was done on Palm Sunday with the journey to the cross.

Offering aspects of the service that tap the five senses: hearing, seeing, touching, smelling, tasting. An example of this was the anointing at the service in April led by the youth.

Use of drama and other creative ways to present the scripture for the day.

Youth Team

A search has been launched for a new Director of Children, Youth and Families Ministry. Our hope is to have a person identified, trained and in place for the fall start-up on September 8th.

The Search Committee for this role includes: Rich Latella, Mitch Reading, Dick Kunsch, Nancy Cressman, Elisa Khan, Teresa Olsen, Mo O'Neill and Sonya Sowards.

Children, Youth and Families Team

Team Members: Invitations were extended to several past and current CE leaders, Sunday School teachers and parents of school-aged children to attend Christian Education (CE) team planning sessions to work on this area of ministry so important to many at St. John's.

Two sessions one week apart were offered to better accommodate busy work and home schedules. The intent of the sessions was to get an expanded CE group onboard with St. John's new fall schedule, to review findings from the Strategic Planning Workshop and identify actions needed to take the first steps towards improving the CE program.

Topics of discussion and brainstorming included: the new schedule, the expectations for the Christian Education program, preparation of the 2019-2020 program calendar, ideas for teacher development and curriculum, posting of the new Christian Education and Youth staff position, and the importance of tying together the Sunday school and worship experience.

Expectations: Expectation for Children's Sunday school is that it be Bible-based and provide children a familiarity with Bible stories and how those stories apply to their lives today.



Fall Schedule: We discussed the impact of the new schedule on our Sunday school and the decision to keep Sunday school at the same length (60 minutes). We also discussed why keeping the upstairs and downstairs large group gatherings separate makes sense.

Program Calendar: The calendar for the entire 2019-2020 year will be put together by the end of August. In addition to paper and email copies of the calendar, the up-to-date calendar information will be easily accessible from our website and Facebook page. We will also make sure parents know where the calendar is found.

As part of the calendar discussion we talked about having more Special Sundays (i.e. "built-in breaks" from the lesson plan). Ideally a Special Sunday would occur once every four weeks. Special Sundays would provide opportunity to host service projects, intergenerational learning activities, and rotational events, such as we did on Palm Sunday when the children rotated from classroom to classroom to learn about Holy Week. In addition to giving children and teachers a break from the usual classes, Special Sundays provide an attraction to encourage more families to come to Sunday school.

The CE team will work over the summer to identify dates and themes for these Special Sundays. Help will be needed to plan and hold each event. School-aged parents, older adults and youth will be asked to lead or provide other support for each event. This is a way for us to expand our involvement of people beyond Sunday school teachers, an element in the feedback from the March leadership session.

Curriculum & Teacher Development: Due to time constraints, we touched briefly on curriculum and teacher development. Except for our 5th and 6th grade teacher who moved to Florida, our other children's Sunday school teachers are expected to return in the fall. It was noted that in the past whenever teacher development sessions were offered, the teachers didn't come. Providing a web seminar or a TED Talk might be more effective given teachers busy schedules. Sparkhouse offers educational resources that might be of help.

Plans will go ahead to hold a teacher workshop one Sunday in August. The timing will allow the new staff position person to come onboard and for planning and coordination of Special Sundays with traditional lesson plan schedule. One idea to reconsider are Prize Wheels. In the past, the kids loved these. Flexibility and the openness to try new ideas and retry old ones that worked before are key.

Adult Sunday School: Several of our attendees were not aware of the Sunday school classes besides Happy Hour that St John's offers adults. They would be interested in attending adult classes provided the classes meet their interests. Consideration should be given to new classes such as and introduction to the Bible (e.g. Old and New Testaments for "Dummies") and educating adults on community needs. The importance of having the new staff person oversee adult Sunday school was noted.

The importance of **connecting Sunday school and worship** is seen as key to increasing worship attendance by getting families to regularly worship together. Various means beyond Happy Hour should be explored to encourage parents to

stay in the building during Sunday school. An expanded offering of adult classes, better communication of adult learning opportunities, requiring parents to signin/sign-out with their location should be considered.

Top three actions:

Develop full 2019-2020 program calendar to include all Christian Education and Youth & Family Events by early August.

Integrate technology and more interactive learning mechanisms into the classrooms (perhaps start with short Sparkhouse videos, and move on from there)

Explore use of web seminar, TED Talk, or Sparkhouse educational resources for teacher development

We began by sharing where we saw God in the past few weeks.

The meeting was called to order at 7:50 p.m. with a prayer offered by Pastor Krommes.

Meeting minutes from the April 8, 2019 meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Dick Kunsch and seconded by Kelly Gallagher to approve the minutes. The motion was approved with no objections or abstentions.

Staff Reports:

Pastor's Report from May 13th

Debbie Gordon will graduate on May 14th.

Pastor requests an increase in her housing allowance to \$40,000.

Motion made by Mitch Reading and seconded by Sandy Zimmermann to increase the 2019 housing allowance of Pastor Cynthia Krommes from \$25,000 to \$40,000 with the additional \$15,000 being deducted from her salary. Motion was approved with no objections or abstentions.

Confirmation is scheduled for June 9th.

Motion made by Sandy Zimmermann and seconded by Donna Searchfield to confirm the following young people on Sunday, June 9th – Stephen Hollander, Anderson McMahon, Zachary Pekofsky, William Stotler, Margaux VanDerveer, Sarah Yonosh, and Katherine Yonosh. Motion was approved with no objections or abstentions.

VBS and Afternoon adventures is coming together and we have 78 registrations.

Pastor requested ushers for George Mansur's funeral.

Pastor and Sandy Zimmermann also shared information from Synod Assembly about The Vitality Team. We plan to send a group to Vitality Team training on Saturday, November 9th.

- J. Quinn's Report from May 6th

A motion was made by Don Titus and seconded by Sandy Zimmermann to approve the Pastor and Staff Reports. Motion was approved with no objections or abstentions.

Finance Committee minutes from April 29th and April financial report – Don Titus noted that the financial picture is better than last year and there was discussion of the causal factors. The Committee would like Council to reconsider their decision to rescind the two Outreach Funds from the Reserve Fund. Mitch Reading suggested and Dick Kunsch moved that the Committee's request should go to the Executive Committee for clarification and a more informed discussion will follow at the next Council meeting. Kelly Gallagher seconded and the motion passed.

Stewardship minutes from April 30th – Pastor Wilk Miller will be the speaker on Stewardship Sunday (November 17th) and the Committee is deciding on a theme.

Welcoming Team minutes from May 9th – Donna Searchfield explained our current newcomers' process, called "The Way." We conduct two sessions per year, led by lay leaders, and team up newcomers with mentors. Each session lasts approximately six Sundays and we invite committee chairs to make presentations to our newcomers and explain how they can get involved based on their spiritual gifts inventories. We do need more participation from the committee chairs and the congregation and Donna welcomed suggestions on how to get more folks to connect with our newcomers. Sandy proposed providing the newcomers' bios to the congregation earlier in the process to encourage more congregants to become mentors.

Social Ministry minutes from May 1st

The Committee requested that Council exempt the MaaSae Girls and Angel Tree funds from being transferred into the new Reserved Fund. Discussion on this potential motion was tabled until Council's next meeting, pending review of the issue by the Executive Committee.

Debbe Welsh attended a security training meeting at St. Peter's. St. Peter's has requested that a trained participant be present at St. Peter's every time we serve and Council discussed approaches to respond to their request.

Christian Education minutes from April 9th

The Committee participated in joint strategic planning with Worship & Music.

The Scholarship Committee would like to award three scholarships.

Sandy Zimmermann moved to grant Cole O'Neill, Carmen Murphy, and Gabrielle VanDerveer the St. John's scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 each. Rick Kramer seconded and the motion was approved with no objections or abstentions

Council reviewed the draft job description for a Director of Children, Youth and Family Ministries and made suggestions. We will also ask our Personnel Committee to review it. When the final job description is approved, we will put together a search and hiring committee. Mitch asked for concrete comments from Council by May 20th and he will call for a vote over email so that we can move forward quickly.

Worship and Music from May 7th

Brian Greenwald summarized Holy Week and noted that worship bags are much appreciated by children. The Council discussed in detail a motion proposed by the Worship & Music and Christian Education Committees. At the close of the discussion, Dick Kunsch made the following motion and Sandy Zimmermann seconded: "Based on congregational response through the Strategic Planning Process, we will begin a new Sunday schedule on September 8, 2019 as follows:

8:30 a.m. Coffee and Fellowship 9:00-10:00 a.m. Education 10:15 a.m. Worship"

The motion was approved with no objections or abstentions.

Communication of this change will include rationale and progress reports and be given through all of our communication methods, including a letter via U.S. Mail. The congregation will be assured that there will be an evaluation process. Dr. Elise Brown will continue to help and oversee all of the changes implemented by the strategic planning process.

Property minutes from May 6th

Rick and Bobbi gave an update on the work on the Sunday school entrance work.

We need a revised proposal for the Eagle Scout project.

We had two quotes for resealing and striping the Circle and south parking lot. Hopson Seal-a-Lot was chosen but the expense is outside of the property budget so the Finance Committee will look at ways in which we would cover that expense. Council approved the following motion from the Property Committee: We will contract with Hopson Seal-a-Lot to provide resealing and striping the Circle and the south parking lot for \$7,580. The motion was approved pending funding.

The Committee is considering the value of a property condition assessment that would allow us to better plan for upcoming property expenses. The Committee reviewed proposals for this work and would like to engage Seiler + Drury, an architectural and engineering firm, which can provide the most broad and personalized services. A discussion and motion was tabled until next month so that the Finance Committee can explore options to finance this project.

Old Business:

Lock up sheet was circulated.

New Business:

Pastor announced her retirement date as June 7, 2020 and commended St. John's for being an asset to the community. She will write a letter to the congregation announcing her retirement and will also include information about the change in worship schedule. Pastor will call the bishop tomorrow so that Council members can begin meetings with the synod regarding the transition.

A motion was made by Mitch Reading and seconded by Stephen Drewes at 9:55 p.m. and the motion was approved. The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.
