





From the Pastor:

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ. I am Pastor Wayne Shelor (with a long "e"). I respond to just about anything, but Pastor Wayne is preferred. I am excited that I have the opportunity to walk with you in this time of transition.

Transitions always come with a bit of discomfort, like when you are crossing the street in Manhattan trying to avoid the oncoming wall of humanity, the pot holes filled with water and trash, and the blaring impatient taxies. Yet we find a way to get everyone across. Transitions are also a time ripe with possibilities. They provide us with an opportunity to hear additional voices, reflect on who we are, clarify what is most important to us, evaluate how we are functioning, and choose how we wish to proceed from here into whatever God has in store for us.

I like to garden, so I often liken my work as an Interim Pastor to gardening. I understand my basic responsibility is to help St. John's have the best garden soil possible. This process will involve assessment of the nutrients already present, some weeding of things which are not where we believe they should



All to make sure this garden is as well prepared as it can be when your next "Settled Pastor" (this is the term we use for one who serves without an end date in mind) arrives to begin her/his journey with you.

I am often asked how long this will take. Please understand this is not a mechanical process in which we flip the right switches, or check all the boxes and everything proceeds in a straight line. This is an "organic process," one of starts and stops, development and growth which has factors which are beyond our influence or control, just like waiting for a plant to bloom, or for a twenty-something child to "get it." I really do not mean to be trite, but it will take as long as it takes. It is much more important for St. John's to do this well than to do it quickly.

In this process we will encounter many twists, turns, and wonder-filled moments before I depart to begin this process with another community of faith, and your new Settled Pastor arrives. In the meantime, please keep me, the Transition Team, the Congregational Council, and this ministry in your regular prayers. And let's see if we can see and understand what God has in mind for this amazing place called St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Dear parents,

I know that all of us remain in a heightened state of anxiety with the start of the school year. Considering the survey responses and our classroom's capacity for students six feet apart, St. John's Children's Sunday School will be at home this fall. We will reevaluate this decision in November for the winter session.

There are two options for at home Sunday School beginning on Sunday, September 13th.



1. Virtual: At 9 a.m. each Sunday, we will meet via Zoom. The children will have opening together and then split in to two groups. Group 1 will be Pre-K through 2nd lead by Miss Elisa and Miss Arlene. Group 2 will be 3rd through 6th will be led by Miss Jen.

2. Email: A version of the day's lesson will be sent via email for the family to do together on Sunday or later in the week.

You can choose to commit to one version or do both versions to better accommodate your family's needs at this time. Regardless of the option you choose, we will be providing copies of the activity pages and craft supplies. Pick up for supplies will be Saturday, September 12th from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. There will be a scavenger hunt to pick up special Sunday School goodies and an opportunity to leave a chalk message.

- Property Committee from May 12, 2020 and June 1, 2020 accepted as presented.
- Worship and Music Committee from June 4, 2020 accepted as presented.
- Welcome Team Committee no meeting but they did put up the new "summer sign".
- Social Ministry Committee from June 3, 2020 accepted as presented.
- Fellowship Committee did not meet
- Columbarium Committee did not meet

Executive Committee – did not meet

Motion by Sandra Zimmermann, Second by Kelly Gallagher to accept committee reports; Motion passed.

Old Business

- Pastor Ron Wesemann will join us at our July 13, 2020 meeting. We will do an in-person meeting at the church for those who can attend and also offer a Zoom or Conference Call option. Meeting place TBD.
- Mitch Reading looking ahead to the pastor transition team and asked for two council members to consider being on that team.
- Reopening:
 - We need to follow the guidelines of our insurance company (who are following CDC guidelines). This is a must to address possible insurance and litigation issues. Their guidelines have been relayed to the W&M Committee.
 - What will be the guidelines on total allowable capacity in the sanctuary? TBD.
 - In-person worship will begin the weekend of July 4/5th 2020.
 - Restated the need to use all available forms of communication to broadcast information to our members.

New Business

- On May 19, 2020, the Christian Ed and Youth and Family Committee made an e-mail motion:
 - To accept the recommendations of the Scholarship Review Team and award four, \$2,000 scholarships as designated by the review team. Motion passed.
 - On May 19, 2020, Mitch Reading called for a council e-mail vote to approve the motion from the Christian Ed and Youth and Family Committee. Motion passed. Also see Dir of Children, Youth and Family Ministry report.
- o On June 2, 2020, the Property Committee made an e-mail motion:
 - Property selects Aarons Asbestos & Demolition Services, LLC; 1005 Pontiac Rd, Suite 373, Drexel Hill, PA 19026, to remove the asbestos containing floor tiles in St. John's ground floor Hallway (and all touching hallways), Stairwell, Creation Room/Nursery and Kley Hall at a cost of \$13,316.00. \$8000.00 will be allocated from the Property Budget and the balance taken from a fund TBD by Finance. The work to commence ASAP. Motion passed.
 - On June 3, 2020, Mitch Reading called for a council e-mail vote to approve the motion from the Property Committee. Motion passed. \$5,316 will be taken from the Capital Improvement Fund.
 - June 3, 2020, Aarons was notified to proceed and Phase One of their work will begin June 19,
 2020. Phase One will be the hall area from the Narthex Doors to just before the Office door. Phase
 Two, which is the rest of the work will begin after the completion of Phase One.
- o Discussion on live-streaming our worship service when we reopen verses recorded for You-Tube viewing:
 - Live-streaming is new technology for us with a learning curve and estimated expense of \$5,000 -\$6,000.
 - Pastor Krommes would like to see us continue to have an on-line service option:
 - Our on-line services have reconnected members to our worship who could not otherwise attend.
 - We believe we have reached other non-members.
 - Memorial Wreath Funds would be good to use for any new costs incurred.
 - There is a wealth of information through the Synod for on-line services.
 - Council charged the Electronics Committee to review options and make recommendations back to council.

Motion by Mitch Reading, Second by Bobbi Riley to adjourn; Motion passed

Staff Reports

- T. Snyder's Report accepted as written.
- J. Quinn's Report accepted as written.
- J. Wentworth's Report accepted as written.
 Discussion: St. John's was awarded an ELCA Disability Grant and suggestions were made to even plus our proposed plans and add to that grant. Jen did a fine job with this process.
- Pastor's Report accepted as written. Discussion:
 - Pastor is trying to stay as connected as possibly to our shut-in members, but the current state of the world makes that challenging.
 - Pastor Tom Kochenderfer has offered to continue his role as visitation Pastor should that work for St. John's.
 - Pastor Krommes gave council a copy of the Covenant for Retiring Pastors and Expectations for Retired Pastors. These documents will need to be signed by the Pastor, the Council President and a Dean or Bishop. Pastor Krommes' retirement begins September 1, 2020. Her last work day will be August 16, 2020 and she will then be on vacation until the end of August. She has begun the process of cleaning out her office and transitioning work responsibilities. Due to the pandemic restrictions and difficulties evaluating new churches, Pastor and John will stay on the St. John's role for the time being.
 - Motion by Pastor Krommes to confirm Evan DesMaris, Jason O'Neill, Luke Olsen and Nathan Stewart on August 9, 2020 at the 10:00 am service and Andrew Blackledge on August 15, 2020 at the 5:00 pm Evening light service. Motion passed.
 - Motion by Pastor Krommes to thank Rick Kramer for serving as a confirmation guide for four years and to present him with his own Martin Luther Bobble Head Doll. Motion passed.

Motion by Dale Herbranson, Second by Dick Kunsch to accept the staff reports; Motion passed.

Finance Committee and Income & Expense Report from the June 29, 2020 meeting.

- The June month end balance includes the federal PPP funds. It was suggested to remove the PPP funds from the Fund 1 report. Otherwise, income vs expenses are near even YTD.
- Finance has adjusted investment options reducing international exposure.
- Jack Ertell will be sending out a letter to all committees to begin the 2020-2021 budget process.

Motion by Dick Kunsch, Second by Donna Searchfield to accept the Finance Committee and Income & Expense Report; Motion passed.

 Discussion: In-person attendance the first week was 35, the second week was 45 but there was a baptism with a group of family member guests. In-person worship will constantly be evaluated and modified to comply with current CDC guidelines and PA State mandates. See Old Business discussion for Live Streaming our service.

- Social Ministry Committee No Report
- o Fellowship Committee No Report but there are plans for a kitchen clean-up in September
- o Columbarium Committee No Report but some recent Niche sales.
- Executive Committee No Report

Motion by Brian Greenwald, Second by Pam Naylor to accept committee reports; Motion passed.

Old Business

- Live Stream Equipment Purchase: The Electronics Committee presented a concept and equipment proposal, authored by Dale Herbranson, to Live Stream the St. John's worship service. (Full Proposal attached to this month's minutes). We are currently "taping" our worship service on Thursdays and posting to YouTube. The taping process involves 2 hours filming and 10-14 hours prep and editing. For coronavirus reasons, the team doing this work has been kept to a minimum with the prep and editing done by Dale. A Live Stream of the worship should reduce the overall man hours and involve more people. The proposal includes removing the three rear pews on the outside, pulpit side section to create a sound booth area. (Some Property Committee members have some concern about removing these pews more discussion at a later date).
 - Motion by Dick Kunsch, second by Pam Naylor to allow the Electronics Committee to move forward and purchase the necessary equipment, not to exceed \$14,000.00, to set up Live Streaming capabilities.

Discussion:

- Would we plan to continue Live Streaming post coronavirus restrictions? Yes, this
 would be considered new ministry and outreach.
- Who will be involved? A team of trained volunteers will be needed to run the equipment for set up and during worship.
- How will we address "privacy issues" showing members faces, especially children; or the use of personal names during the service? We could make the live stream 'invitation only"; the version posted to YouTube could be edited to remove privacy content; the YouTube version could be minimized to only include core items, readings, sermon, prayers; we could consult with other sources to see what is done.
- For the above reasons; the motion was tabled. All council members are asked to
 research live streaming and council will reconsider this motion in the near future.
- The Interim Process: The Interim Task Group has received a resume for a possible candidate. Mitch
 will circulate it to council members for their review.

- Retirement Party for Pastor Krommes: Rivercrest could not say if they would be able to reopen, so
 the planning committee has moved the August 16th celebration to the St. John's campus. A large
 tent will be set up. Individual boxed meals will be provided. Seating will be arranged to maintain
 social distancing. The planning committee will send out a letter with all the new details. It is very
 important to get all RSVPs in as soon as possible to complete the seating and food requirements.
 We have been blessed to have Pastor Krommes with us for so many wonderful years and this
 celebration party will help us all show our appreciation of her loving time and ministry with us.
 - Motion by Donna Searchfield, second by Stephen Drewes, to move the Retirement Party to the St. John's campus and to allow the Planning Committee to contract with Robert Ryan Caterers and other vendors as necessary to arrange this event. Motion passed.
- Flooring Update: the Property Committee took advantage of the reduced activities at church to remove approximately 5,000 sf of asbestos containing floor tile in June. The work went extremely smoothly and professionally. The Flooring Task Committee has made new floor product recommendations and the Property Committee is in the process of receiving flooring samples and writing final specifications to bid this work.
- Re-opening: per the Worship and Music Committee report, St. John's held their first post Covid inperson services the weekend of July 4/5th. All committees and staff people involved will continue to monitor best practices to accomplish this new worship format.
 - E-Mail Motion from the Worship and Music Committee June 15, 2020: Have two inperson worship services at 8:00 am and 10:00 am on August 9 and 16, 2020. Council vote approved this motion. (E-mail record attached)

New Business

 Per an outreach request from the SEPA Synod Bishop, and with the support of Pastor Krommes, Stephen Drewes made a motion, second by Donna Searchfield, to donate \$1,000.00 to help with the medical expenses of the Rev. COVID UPDATE


Tanzania hasn't issued a summary of their Covid 19 cases for almost two months. Two weeks ago, the President announced that God has cured Covid in Tanzania and we are free to return to normal. The borders have been opened and schools are open again.

Yet in the background, the hospitals are caring daily for Covid patients and neighbors know who is sick at home and who has died at home. But without statistics, no one is able to get a handle on what is really happening with the pandemic in Tanzania.

Covid seems not to have had as horrific an impact on morbidity and mortality as anticipated. Perhaps because of the young average age of the population with 50% of the population being age 15 or below.

Whatever understanding is eventually learned about Covid in Tanzania, it is already abundantly clear that the greater impact of Covid has been upon the economy. The tourist industry has collapsed and brought about great unemployment. The lost revenues in many industries are bound to lead to struggles with famine, less access to health care, and difficulty for students to remain in schools.

USAID has predicted that the after effects of Covid may do away with decades of development across the African continent. Our challenge is no longer an epidemic but rather a doubling down for development.



Sent to Repent, Repay, and Reconcile

Well before the murder of George Floyd in my own back yard, I had been asked to share the meditation at the ELCA Chicago offices Wednesday morning chapel service where the Gospel was the Great Commission. Seven days after his death and in the midst of an ongoing eruption of outrage and rage over never ending injustice, the service was going to happen. Wouldn't it be better to have a person of color speak rather than a person of white male privilege? No such reprieve and so I stumbled forward.

Still sensing that even now, or especially now, we who strive to follow Jesus are a sent people. "Go" is the command and so we are sent. I am feeling the struggle of being sent:

- To repent and acknowledge my complicity and privilege
- To seek to restore through reparations
- To reconcile or re-create

Reconciliation, or re-creation are a metamorphosis to a new reality – a new creation. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. The old has gone, the new is here." 2 Cor 5:17 Yet reconciliation is costly and hard and creative.

Amongst the Maasai people, who have been my teachers now for many years in Tanzania, we learn of both the cost of reconciliation and the power to create a new reality.

One of the most serious offenses among the community is to kill, to murder. And murder can lead quickly to outrage, vengeance, and further violence. When this occurs, the perpetrator, admitting his guilt retreats to the home of his mother, where he literally, lays down under her bed of protection. The murderer has thus confessed and admitted his sin and as he is in community, the community seeks a way to reconciliation.

NEW SCHOOL OF NURSING CAMPUS OPENS

School Closures for Covid provided an opportunity for the SON to complete preparations for the move into our new campus at Ekenywa. We celebrated and welcomed the students into our new and renovated facility on June 1st. This long time dream has become a reality thanks to so many of you who have been absolutely incredibly generous and supportive.





The elders gather to seek reconciliation. First a negotiation on reparations. How many cattle, the most precious of Maasai possessions, indeed their very lifeblood, how many cattle will be paid in reparation. The cost of reconciliation is great and many cattle are required. When agreed upon, a ceremony of reconciliation is called by the healer-priest, the *loiboni*.

Both families gather together in a great circle. Into the center, two nursing mothers come, one from each family. They exchange their infants and nurse the other's child. The cost of reconciliation is great.

Then two of the senior elders, the male leaders come to the center of the circle where each, with a slight slice from their elongated knife, draw blood from the wrist of the other and intermingle it with their own. The cost of reconciliation is great.

Then a blessing is pronounced by the *loiboni*, spoken and with the sprinkling of milk in a baptismal like ritual, which calls upon God to bless this reconciliation. It is holy work.

As the ritual ends, the *loiboni* announces the miracle of reconciliation, the hope of a new creation. For now, the two waring families are transformed into a new, larger, single family. It is a symbolic and literal creation of a new family. Even to the extent that intermarriage between them is now forbidden. "The old has gone, the new is here."

The cost of reconciliation is great. Not to reconcile leads unto death. The hope of reconciliation is even greater. In Christ, "The old will go, the new will come."

Therefore my friends, let us Go! We are sent. Remembering always Christ's promise to us, "I am with you always, even until the end of the age."
