A Hymn for the New Year

Little did Martin Luther know in 1534 when he wrote the words for his beloved Christmas Carol *Vom Himmel Hoch* (From Heaven Above) how poignant they would be today. Most likely it was written for his family's Christmas Eve devotions. Luther intended stanzas 1-7 be sung by a man dressed as an angel and stanzas 8-15 by children. Luther later composed the melody we associate with the text in 1539.

The angel portrayal is very evident in 1-3:

From heav'n above to earth I come, to bear good news to ev'ry home!

Glad tidings of great joy I bring to all the world and gladly sing:

To you this night is born a child of Mary, chosen virgin mild;

This newborn child of lowly birth shall be the joy of all the earth.

This is the Christ, God's Son most high, who hears your sad and bitter cry,

Who will himself your Savior be and from all sin will set you free.

The two closing stanzas proclaim the joy of His birth and turn us to a new year:

My heart for very joy now leaps; my voice no longer silence keeps;

I too must sing with joyful tongue the sweetest ancient cradle song.

"Glory to God in highest heav'n, who unto us the Son has Giv'n."

With angels sing in pious mirth a glad new year to all the earth.

Right now we can't be together to sing with the angels. The joy of a glad new year to all the earth is needed more than ever.

From the Director of Children, Youth, and Family Ministries:

Happy New Year! Happy 2021!

I think most of us are wise enough to realize that the flip of the calendar year doesn't miraculously make the old year's problems disappear. So how can we deal with the stuff of 2020 in 2021?

The traditional way is by setting New Year's resolutions and making goals for the year. Figure out what you want to do and make a list of steps to see it accomplished. Most people think about ideas related to their health, jobs, finances, and lifestyle. But how about goals for your spiritual and church life this year? Or your kids' lives? In Baptism our parents and later we ourselves at Confirmation make a promise to: care for others and the world, work for justice and peace, share the good news of Jesus by our words and actions, know the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and the Apostles' Creed, have a Bible and read it, and learn to trust God. How are you doing with these promises? How did you do with trusting God to see you through the pandemic? There are so many things you can do for your spiritual life this year regarding these promises. You could resolve to attend virtual or in-person worship weekly as a family, read the Bible or a children's Bible once a week and talk about what was read, or work on memorizing the Lord's Prayer together. If you aren't sure where to begin, just ask.

The non-traditional way of dealing with the old year's problems is by changing your mindset—meaning change how you look at the world around you. But just like New Year's resolutions, it's easier said than done. You have to train your brain to look for the positives of life instead of jumping to find the negatives. The place to start is with God by asking him to help you think differently. After that you could start a gratitude journal, read a book on the topic of mindset, or using a devotional that focuses on trusting God, faith, gratitude, or attitude. Worshipping each week is a great way to get that reminder each week of God's presence in your life. If you are musically inclined like me, consider memorizing the hymn "It Is Well with My Soul."

Whichever route you choose to deal with 2020s leftovers, just remember what Mary said in the Children's Christmas Eve service "God will be with us each step of the way."



- Frustration on lack of commitment and follow through.
- Broad ambivalence.

Question for thought: Are we stuck between being a Program Lead Congregation verses a Pastoral Lead Congregation?

- A Program Lead Congregation shifts the focus on how people connect to the church from just the Pastor to the activities.
- Are our members capable of being a Program Lead Congregation?
- · Can we do the work needed to be a Program Lead Congregation?
- Are we too focused Internally verses Externally?
- St. John's has gone back and forth between these models several times over the years. Do we have leadership / membership burn out?

Our "Interim Lead Period" should be used to help us resolve our identity to prepare us to know who we are and what we will want from our next pastor.

Remember - "Church" is the big picture going beyond the walls. Worship is just a part of that entity.
