

A New Hymn for Lent

Augsburg Fortress, the publishing arm of the ELCA, recently published a hymnal supplement which gathered the best of new hymn texts and tunes for use in our churches. The books have been purchased for the Adult Choir and will be used as we return to singing together. Meanwhile I'm providing you a sneak peek. The text for this hymn was written by Ruth Duck, an ordained pastor in the United Church of Christ, a liturgical theologian and retired professor of worship and a leading contemporary champion for and developer of inclusive language worship sources. It is set to the familiar tune *SLANE* to which we sing "Be Thou My Vision." Sing or read these words and allow them to help guide your Lenten journey.

- When we are tested and wrestle alone, famished for bread when the world offers stone, nourish us, God, by your word and your way, food that sustains us by night and by day.
- When in the desert we cry for relief, pleading for paths marked by certain belief, lift us to love you beyond sign and test, trusting your presence, our only true rest.
- 3. When we are tempted to barter our souls, trading the truth for the power to control, teach us to worship and praise only you, seeking your will in the work that we do.
- 4. When we have struggled and searched through the night, sorting and sifting the wrong from the right, Savior, surround us with circles of care, angels of healing, of hope, and of prayer.

Happy Valentine's Day!

I had a conversation with someone a few months ago about how we don't learn to memorize Bible verses anymore. For better or worse, yes, that practice is fallen out of favor in a world where the Bible is always at out fingertips. There is something nice though about being able to recall a verse in the Bible whenever you need comfort, assurance, or inspiration. Given the trying times that we're currently living in it seems like we need those Bible verses more than ever. So this month, I'm going to challenge all of us as family units or as individuals to memorize a Bible verse. Since it is February, I think one about love is the perfect place to start. Below are just a few of the many verses about love in the Bible. Pick just one to focus on for the month. Families, I suggest you memorize the same verse and make the choice of which one together.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16

"No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us." 1 John 4:12

- "We love because he first loved us." 1 John 4:19
- "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant." 1 Corinthians 13:4
- "And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." 1 Corinthians 13:13 Suggestions for how to memorize your verse:
- -Copy down the verse over and over again either in print or in cursive or outside in chalk
- -Copy the verse onto blank paper and do an illustration around it
- -Write the words out on individual pieces of masking tape. Then tape the masking tape to either Legos or Jenga blocks. You can make a game of how fast can you put those words in order.
- -Using pieces of paper or index cards write one word on each card. See how fast you can put the words in order. Make more than one set to race as a family.
- -While you're in the process of memorizing it, write it down on a sticky note and put it in different places within the house . That way when you see the note you will stop say it.
- -Add the verse to your daily prayers.

With a little bit of work and fun you'll be able to memorize your Bible verse and have it to hold onto as we move forward with 2021.

Oh what a year!



Oh what a year!


Yet a year of growth as we explored our own white fragility and privilege and struggled to find ways that we could be a part of the needed change in us


