Touch That Soothes and Heals

Below is another hymn from the new Hymnal Supplement *All Creation Sings.* We used it as our Hymn of the Day on Easter 2 when in the Gospel Thomas questioned Jesus and He responded "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side . . . Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." The hymn, especially its refrain, provides a charge for our service and ministry to the world as we "Go in peace, serve the Lord!"

Mary Louise Bringle, the hymn writer, is a Professor of Philosophy and Religious Studies at Brevard College, North Carolina. Her Ph.D. in practical and pastoral theology is from Emory University. An award-winning hymn writer whose original texts and translations appear in the hymnals of numerous denominations in North America and Scotland, she has served as President of The Hymn Society in the U.S. and Canada. Three of her hymns are included in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, one of which—726—*Light Dawns on a Weary World* is familiar to many of us.

1 Touch that soothes and heals the hurting, hands that break a loaf of bread; steps that walk beside the weary, bearing burdens in their stead:

Refrain

"See my hands and feet," said Jesus, love arisen from the grave.
"Be my hands and feet," said Jesus,
"live as ones I died to save."

- 2 Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit ones in need of care, give the homeless warmth and shelter: Christ will find a welcome there. Refrain
- 3 Love and serve without distinction all earth's people, first and least. Know within each act of kindness hope and wholeness are increased. Refrain
- 4 Hands that beckon little children, bind a wound, prepare a meal, feet that rush to share good tidings, Christ arisen, still reveal. Refrain

Happy Easter!



The 7- to 10-year-olds had a great time running down the hill and hunting for eggs across the whole back lawn. Transition Team Update

Your Transition Team wishes to thank all the members who participated in the recent survey. Although it may have seemed like a repeat of the Kairos survey, the Team felt it best to garner additional, more specific information regarding the characteristics you would like in a new pastor. Some of the questions were to determine if there were any changes from the Kairos survey process. We are now taking both survey findings and working on the Mission Site Profile for the Synod. The MSP includes 40 ministry tasks and 25 gifts for ministry, so the Team's task is to prayerfully consider the input from the Kairos and recent survey comments as we determine the critical five and five most desired tasks, and then the top five of the gifts. The overall MSP profile, when fully completed, will be reviewed and approved by the Council before being submitted to the Synod.


