Two Congregations Become One: The St. John's - Central Merger

In 1962, the congregation of St. John's moved into their new building on the Circle. Over the next several years, the congregation continued to grow in its new location. In Phoenixville there was another Lutheran congregation, Central Lutheran Church, founded only a few years after St. John's and located at the corner of Church and Main Street.



Founded by English-speaking Lutherans, Central was chartered in 1875 and incorporated in 1878. It purchased the Mennonite Meeting Hall, which had been built in 1873 replacing a smaller structure first built in 1794. The Mennonites had a long history in the Phoenixville area and had often lent use of their place of worship for other newly founded congregations, including St. John's. However, the Mennonite congregation, founded in a more agrarian era, continued to dwindle in membership and chose to sell their building. Central Lutheran acquired their building and also the adjacent substantial cemetery.

With pastors who came primarily from synods in central Pennsylvania, the congregation grew slowly, but steadily. In 1903, it built a large addition to the church. Central was known for its fine music programs and involvement in the Phoenixville community.

In 1950, it celebrated its 75th anniversary. In the early 1950s, a major renovation took place to make the basement more usable and enhance the overall building.

Despite the renovations, as the congregation moved into the 1960s, membership leveled off and weekly attendance dropped. With six churches in two blocks of Church Street, parking for worship was a detriment to all of the churches. In 1967, Central's new pastor was Rev. Leon C. Zinkler, recently ordained as a Lutheran Pastor by the Northeast Pennsylvania Synod after having served as an ordained Methodist pastor for the previous six years.

In 1968, discussions between the two congregations began. Pr. William A. Davis (who had come to St. John's the year before) and Pr. Zinkler and four lay members from each congregation met as a committee, later referring to themselves as the merger committee. An early agreement, at the April 28 meeting, was to recommend to the church councils that confirmation classes be held jointly with the pastors sharing in leading the classes. By the committee's May meeting, both councils had approved. Also at the May meeting, a subcommittee was formed to write a draft merger document and corporate resolution for review. The four members of the subcommittee were the two pastors, David M. Frees, Jr. of Central and Mary Baylitts of St. John's. It was agreed that David Frees would write a draft of the two documents to be reviewed by the pastors and finalized by the entire merger committee.

The goal was to have completed documents ready to submit to both councils by September 1st and sent to the Synod Council for approval by September 22nd. If approved by the two church councils and Synod, congregational meetings would be held in late September with January 1st as the target date for an official merger of the two congregations. The merger document and the corporate resolution were approved by both church councils and Synod. September 29th was set for congregational meetings to conduct voting.

On September 29th, at congregational meetings, the vote for the merger of Central and St. John's was held. The results were:

With both congregations approving, the legal process of combining two 'corporate' entities had to occur and approval by the Synod. Attorney Fred Deininger undertook the necessary legal work while a committee worked on combining finances of the two congregations and planning for special activities to launch the "new" congregation. The two pastors, along with David Wilson of Central and Roger Sifford of St. John's, set upon the task of drafting a new congregational constitution.

At their November meeting, it was agreed to hold a special congregational meeting on the afternoon of Sunday, January 5, 1969 to be followed by a congregational buffet dinner. The important business matters at the meeting would be to officially act on all the necessary details of the merger—adopting a new constitution and bylaws, approving a congregational budget, extending pastoral calls and electing a new church council. The President of the newly created Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, Dr. William A. Janson, Jr. was invited to preach at that Sunday's worship service.

In early December, letters were sent to all members of the congregations noting that the "new" congregation would officially begin in January, 1969 with details of the service for January 5th, the congregational meeting and dinner. Members were asked to confirm their attendance as the buffet dinner was being catered at a cost of \$1.20 per/person (no charge for children under five).

As the congregation moved forward, services would be initially held at both locations. Beginning the following week, "on the Circle" were worship at 8:15 and 11 a.m. and Sunday School at 9:30; a service would be held at Church and Main at 9:30. Both pastors would continue to serve the congregation. Pr. Davis would ultimately serve as the pastor until retiring in 1986. Pr. Zinkler left later in 1969 to serve as an interim pastor and consultant to several Lutheran and UCC congregations in northeastern Pennsylvania until retiring from ministry in 1999. Additionally, he earned his doctorate and was a full-time Sociology professor at East Stroudsburg University from 1969 until retirement in 2002.



The "new" St. John's had challenges as the members blended into a single congregation, some whose opposition was so strong that they chose to worship elsewhere. The use of the downtown building dwindled over the years and by the late 1970s the property was regarded as a financial drain. In 1980, St. John's sold the former Central Lutheran to the Historical Society of the Phoenixville Area. The money from the sale, \$87,400, was used to establish the Outreach Fund still in existence today.

Symbolic of the unifying of two congregations, the jointly held confirmation classes begun in 1968 came to fulfillment with the confirmation class of 1969. The confirmation photo shows 23 smiling confirmands with both Pastors Zinkler and Davis.

With appreciation and celebration!

We know how the old saying goes, "Time flies when we're having fun." For many at St. John's, our Director of Music, Thomas Snyder—Deacon, or just "Tom" to most of us, has been faithfully part of our congregation as leader, director, in many diverse ways. And now, that time extends back to over 30 years! So, it's time to pause and do what Lutherans love to do: celebrate! Although the pandemic messed with many events, we are continuing to make things right by celebrating Tom's anniversary during our Reformation Sunday service, October 30, 2022. During that service we will debut a



new hymn "Word of God, Come Down on Earth."¹ It was commissioned by the musical friends; choirs, bells, instrumentalists, and the listeners at St John's in grateful appreciation of Tom's many years of service to the people of this congregation.

As with Tom's and Joe Lewis' combined, earlier anniversary in 2010, an anthem was commissioned by St. John's, and composed by Thomas Keesecker. Keesecker's latest, "Word of God, Come Down on Earth," has since been published by Augsburg-Fortress and is now available online or through sheet music retailers. The text of the new hymn is one of Tom's favorites. Also, that service will feature the earlier 2010, "Sing to the Lord a New Song," as the Psalm of the Day. So please mark your calendars and plan to attend! There will be further announcements as plans develop.

Although funds were collected by the Choir and Adult Bells, we are still accepting contributions for the dedication of the new hymn in Tom's honor. Please feel free and we encourage you to place your contribution in the offering plate. But please be sure to "ear-mark" it by writing on the outside, "Snyder Celebration Fund."

For those who may not know, Tom is a graduate in music from Susquehanna University in 1974. He grew up and resides in Schwenksville, within the nearby Perkiomen Valley. Though originally from the Reformed Church, Tom has spent most of his career faithfully serving the Lutheran Church, first in the LCA that continues now as the ELCA. After a stint in teaching, he was called in 1975 to Zion Lutheran Church, Spring City as Director of Music. In October 1983, Tom was recognized by the LCA as a "Certified Lay Professional Leader." After the 1987 merger that saw the creation of the ELCA, his title was changed to "Associate in Ministry." In 1990 Tom began his call at St John's as "Director of Music." He was consecrated or recognized as "Deacon" by the ELCA in 2017.

And now, for some well-earned praise for Tom, highlighting a "few," of the things he does for our congregation. Tom prepares and provides for us diverse and fresh music for worship. He has worked with our organists; first with Joseph Lewis who retired some 8 years ago but who still visits and guest plays for us often. In addition to working with organist John Quinn as well as with the various musical programs at St Johns: the Adult Choir, Youth Choir, Adult Handbells, the (exciting) Children's Handells and supporting music in our Sunday Church School, Tom often reaches out to the wider musical community who crave good, solid, inspirational, or religious music. Until the pandemic, he continued the annual St. Johns & Friends Concert series begun by his predecessors many decades ago. The series provides an opportunity to blend members of other church choirs or friends in our community who love singing with our Adult Choir to perform major works in our acoustically superb sanctuary. Often there's an orchestra. These events usually took place on the1st Sunday evening in May. Tom hopes to resume the series soon. Additionally, Tom works with local orchestral and instrumental enthusiasts who play together under his direction, as the "Providence Chamber Orchestra." Several times a year they present some truly wonderful symphonic sounds with their performances, again in our St John's sanctuary.

Behind the scenes Tom diligently performs the jobs of several people. Except for the folks in choir, bell ringers or those in the business of making music, Tom's work as Director is more of a combination "Director," and "Producer." He pays attention to the many details that allows all of our volunteer musicians to prepare and grow into the music we sing or perform. Tom's work as Deacon has been to advocate to many other groups in our congregation. He serves on several committees: Worship & Music, Education and Property. Tom has worked with pastors, guest pastors, musical guests, students, teachers or employees who have played, performed or worked within our parish spaces. Occasionally and recently, Tom has led us in worship.

When Tom leads us in performing an anthem, always while standing with his back to the congregation, he so often sets the right religious mood! He has strengthened the choir program by mixing many of the best voices while teaching us the value of listening to each other as we sing or play. But there's more. Tom makes sure we each receive a copy of the score or sheet music. He rehearses the choirs or bells. He takes the time to sort out the parts, in getting us to think about the words we are singing while urging us to listen to one another. works up the "ensemble," to get the right sound. And that's when the fun starts as we begin, "making music." Tom will offer cues, the right sort of emotion, the sense of the moment or the season. And he tells some good jokes. Then, we finally get to rehearse or perform in one of the most beautiful musical spaces in the world—our very own sanctuary! And Tom keeps on working the music as it just gets better. We often see or learn that Tom is already moving ahead to the next round of music, event or work on the agenda. During this last year of the pastoral vacancy, we've enjoyed enthralling Pastor K as he sits up front in the sanctuary with the sound of our singing under Tom's direction. And that's one of the best forms of praising God imaginable. As the words of the psalm within the 2010 anthem says, "Our music is a gift of love, a song we gladly sing!"² Truly we've been blessed.

And so, we look forward to sharing this love and appreciation with Tom this next October 30th. It will be a time to celebrate Reformation in music, the larger Lutheran Church as well as the continuing Reformation in the life of St Johns! Won't you join with us? All are welcome!
