Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope that your Thanksgiving celebrations were joyful. I enjoyed the chance to be a part of the Phoenixville Area Clergy Association's interfaith Thanksgiving service, but I'm very excited that Advent is beginning! The season of Advent is about a lot of different things. It's a season of new beginnings in the Church year, and of course part of Advent is about preparing for our celebration of Christmas at the end of December. Advent isn't just about preparing for Christmas, though that is part of it. Advent is about celebrating God coming to be with us; God does that in what one of my teachers once described as "in history, in mystery, and in majesty." I'm going to unpack that a bit, but I'm going to do it a little bit out of order.

The first way we celebrate God coming to us is in history. Roughly 2027 years ago, God did a wonderful and miraculous thing. In that time, Jesus entered the world. The Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us. As we prepare for Christmas, and as we hear those stories each week in Advent of John the Baptist and of Mary, our Advent worship recalls that wait for Jesus' coming to us in history.

But we know that it's not just about that one event, two millennia ago. Jesus will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. Advent is about preparing for Christ's return just as much as it's about preparing to celebrate when he dwelt among us. The second readings in our worship services this Advent bring a particular focus on the second coming, and are about looking forward to that great and glorious day.

And, as a sidebar, the readings for these last three Sundays in Ordinary Time that we've just finished also look ahead to the Day of the Lord, to Jesus' predictions of what the coming of the kingdom of God will be like. There's a movement in some churches to extend Advent into those three weeks, to help emphasize the Advent themes of the day of Christ's return, and to give Advent more time to sit with them before the focus shifts to the coming in history. I first heard of the extended Advent idea when I was in seminary, and I've become more intrigued by that idea with each passing year; maybe in the future we'll explore a longer Advent season here at St. John's.

Regardless of whether we celebrate Advent for four weeks or seven, our celebrations of Christ coming to be with us are wrapped up in some of the greatest, most beautiful mysteries that God has shown to us: Christ's presence coming to us in the Sacraments. A splash of water, a bite of bread and sip of wine—those things don't seem like they could be ways that God could come to us.

But they are. We know that because God has promised it.

That splash of water, combined with God's Word, becomes not just water, but Holy Baptism, washing away sins, immersing the baptized person in Jesus' death and resurrection, bringing them out of death and into life with God. That bread and wine, combined with God's Word, becomes not just bread and wine, but Holy Communion: Jesus' body and blood, given for us for the forgiveness of sins. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, God comes to meet us, not just as a baby born two millennia ago, not just as the conquering Lamb of Revelation, but God comes to meet us, in our everyday lives, at the font and on the altar. One of the things that I'm most excited about this Advent is the chance to celebrate those mysteries; in addition to our normal celebrations of Holy Communion, we're also going to be celebrating two different Holy Baptisms.

Of course, all of our preparation, all of our waiting and celebration, all culminates in Christmas, when we joyfully remember God's coming in history, when we celebrate the mystery of Christ's presence in our lives, and as we look ahead to that time when Christ will come in majesty. As we prepare at St. John's Lutheran Church for Christ's coming among us, in history, in mystery, and in majesty, may your Advent celebrations be filled with hope and touched by God's love, and may your Christmas celebrations reflect the joy of Christ's presence.

# "DAZZLING" PHILADELPHIA HANDBELL ENSEMBLE TO PERFORM AT ST. JOHN'S

St. John's again invites listeners to experience music of the holiday season with the exceptional Philadelphia Handbell Ensemble, 4 p.m., Sunday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>. The program, entitled "Jingle Bells," will be directed by Ron Bellamy and features sacred and secular handbell arrangements for the holiday season. The concert will send you into the night with the warmth of delightful music.

PHE is a community ensemble comprised of auditioned, advanced-level handbell ringers from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware. Musically, PHE's repertoire spans original compositions, transcriptions of classical literature, and arrangements from a wide array of musical genres.

The Ensemble currently plays on six and one-half octaves of Schulmerich bells. In addition, PHE plays two octaves of Schulmerich Silver Melody Bells, five octaves of MelodyChime® chimes, and the lower sixth and seven octaves of Malmark Choirchime® chimes. A large number of percussion instruments round out the Ensemble's artistic presentation.

An advanced range of ringing techniques allows the Ensemble to move beyond the traditional handbell sound and redefines the character of a single instrument, whether it's through percussive stopped sounds or poignant echoes or a shimmering decrescendo. Unlike an orchestra or choir in which each musician is responsible for one line of the texture, a handbell ensemble acts as one instrument, with each musician responsible for particular notes as they appear in the music.

There is no admission charge; however, a freewill offering will be received.

#### **Advent Offering**




#### St. Peter's Advent Dinner Church—begins November 29th, 6:30 p.m.

## Sunday School Spirit Day and PACS Collection December 10th


Christmas Pageant St. John's CYFM is hosting monthly spirit days for Sunday school. During these days, students are invited to wear a themed outfit to church.

#### **Calling All Teachers**


