Dear Friends in Christ.

At the end of this month, I'll have been the called pastor at St. John's Lutheran Church for six months, and what a six months it's been! In our Sunday readings for this year, the Gospel readings are mostly drawn from the Gospel of Mark. One of Mark's Gospel's key features is its author's use of the phrase "and immediately." Mark's narrative connects one scene after another, and everything happens immediately after the last thing. It feels that way in my life, too, as well as in the Gospel readings. In these last six months, I've met a lot of new people (although I have a lot more people to meet, too!), I've begun to meet with groups in the community and get to know Phoenixville, I've led worship and taught Sunday school, and I've celebrated Reformation Sunday, All Saints' Sunday, and Christmas with Saint John's. I've especially enjoyed being able to be part of Vacation Bible School and to see the Sunday school Christmas pageant, as well as being able to join together with the Phoenixville Area Clergy Association for the annual Thanksgiving Eve service. It's been an exciting time, and I've been blessed to share it with you!

It looks like the "and immediately" moments are going to keep going in the new year, as well! At the end of this month, on January 21st, we'll celebrate together and with guests from other churches as I'm officially installed as the pastor. Very shortly after that, February 14th is Ash Wednesday, and then Lent begins, and at the end of February is our annual congregational meeting. And of course, in between those big events, I'm looking forward to being able to continue to visit and meet people, to lead worship, to preach and teach and pray, and to do all of the other things that are part of the work of ministry.

One of the things that I hope I'll be able to do in order to connect with more people from St. John's in the new year is to devote more time to calling and visiting members of the congregation in order to better get to know more people. If you'd like to meet with me, or to have me come to visit you, I'd love to do that. Please let me know, and we can work out a time that will work. If you'd rather not have me visit you at home, I'd also be glad to meet for lunch or coffee, or to meet with you at the church or at another location.

I do have to ask for your help with one part of my visitation ministry: it's both part of my responsibility to visit members of the congregation who are sick or hospitalized, and also something that I'm deeply honored to be able to do. Because of medical privacy laws (which are very important and very good things), hospitals are very restricted in what information they can give out about patients. If you or a member of your family needs to go to the hospital, I'd ask that you please let the church know so that we can set up a visit if you'd like, and so we can be intentional about praying for you or your family member.

As we continue on together, I'm sure that there will be many more exciting events that happen in the congregation and in the community. I hope I'm able to continue to be your pastor for a long time to come, and that we can celebrate many more "and immediately" moments together!
