Dear Friends in Christ,

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

I hope that, in whatever way you celebrate it, your Easter season has been going well and joyfully. Part of the reason that we celebrate Easter for seven weeks, instead of just one Sunday, is that there's just too much to fit in one day's worth of celebration. One of those ongoing themes in the Easter season is a celebration of baptism, because baptism is so closely connected to Jesus' death and resurrection, bringing us out of death to our sins and into life with Jesus. As Saint Paul says, "all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:3-4). While we haven't had the opportunity to celebrate any baptisms at St. John's yet this Easter, there are several other events in our life as a congregation which we've either celebrated recently or will be doing soon, which are closely connected to baptism.



The first of those was our celebration of First Holy Communion, back in March. Communion is deeply connected to baptism. As the presentation of the Communion students said, "In the sacrament of holy baptism, we are welcomed into the body of Christ and sent to share in the mission of God. In the sacrament of holy communion, God unites us in Jesus Christ and nourishes us for that mission." Celebrating with the seven members of the Holy Communion instruction class was wonderful, and being able to have those students help to distribute Holy Communion to the rest of the congregation was a great experience and a great way to celebrate that milestone in their lives of faith.

We'll also soon be celebrating with other members of the congregation as they reaffirm their baptismal promises. On May 19th, we'll be celebrating with five members of the congregation who will have completed their confirmation class. At the center of Confirmation are the baptismal promises: when those students were baptized, their parents and sponsors made those promises for them. When they're confirmed, the confirmands will make those promises for themselves. When we celebrate the welcome of new members to the congregation, those new members are also welcomed by affirmation of baptism. It's a powerful moment, and I'm always excited to be a part of it.

And, of course, we all live out those baptismal promises in countless ways in our lives as we serve other people and share our faith in word and deed. Some of the ways that we do that together as St. John's Lutheran Church include sharing meals with the lunches at St. Peter's and with St. Mary's Shelter; sharing our faith with the students at Vacation Bible School; and serving others on the Appalachia Service Project trip. Those are just a handful of the ways that we as St. John's Lutheran Church live out our baptisms, and I'm excited to be a part of those things as we celebrate the gift of baptism together!



Aluminum Can Collection Update

Effective immediately, aluminum animal food cans are no longer accepted mixed in with aluminum beverage cans by the metal recycle facility we use. The compa-

nies to whom they sell their materials have coded the aluminum content of animal food cans differently than that of beverage cans so they cannot be mixed.

Therefore, St. John's will now only be collecting aluminum beverage cans. All va-

rieties of aluminum beverage cans, such as soda, sparkling water, and adult beverages, are acceptable. Since they are stored for some period as we collect enough weight for a worthwhile drop off, please rinse the cans and be sure they are empty before dropping them off at the church.

Thank you for your continued support of this financially productive ministry. Proceeds from the recycled cans result in hundreds of dollars yearly for our youth activities. Keep those beverage cans coming!

Submissions for *The Circle* newsletter are due on the 18th of every month (except July). Submissions received after this deadline may appear in other applicable St. John's communications and in the following month's newsletter.

When submitting articles, please include <u>complete</u> information such as date, time, location, and how to sign up for events (including links and QR codes to forms). Images are welcome but should be photos taken around St. John's or posters created by the submitter—not stock images or any images downloaded from the Internet which St. John's is not licensed to use.

Communion Records and Prayer Requests




Our constitution defines members eligible to vote at regular meetings of the church as those who "shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contri-

Communion cards can be found in the pew racks at the end of each pew. The card may also be used for prayer requests, address changes, questions, or comments.
