Bishop-elect Penman currently serves as the pastor of St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Conshohocken, and as one of the Synod's Directors for Evangelical Mission. I'm excited for the beginning of Bishop-elect Penman's ministry as bishop.

I'm certain that there are other new beginnings in our life together, and in the life of the congregation. I'm excited to celebrate those new beginnings together with everyone here at St. John's Lutheran Church, and I'm looking forward to seeing where the Holy Spirit will lead us, as individuals and as the church!

Aluminum Can Collection Update

Effective immediately, aluminum animal food cans are no longer accepted mixed in with aluminum beverage cans by the metal recycle facility we use. The companies to whom they sell their materials have coded the aluminum content of animal food cans differently than that of beverage cans so they cannot be mixed.

Therefore, St. John's will now only be collecting aluminum beverage cans. All varieties of aluminum beverage cans, such as soda, sparkling water, and adult beverages, are acceptable. Since they are stored for some period as we col-

lect enough weight for a worthwhile drop off, please rinse the cans and be sure they are empty before dropping them off at the church.

Thank you for your continued support of this financially productive ministry. Proceeds from the recycled cans result in hundreds of dollars yearly for our youth activities. Keep those beverage cans coming!


Thank you Lhötse and Maddie!



When submitting articles, please include <u>complete</u> information such as date, time, location, and how to sign up for events (including links and QR codes to forms). Images are welcome but should be photos taken around St. John's or posters created by the submitter—not stock images or any images downloaded from the Internet which St. John's is not licensed to use.

Our constitution defines members eligible to vote at regular meetings of the church as those who "shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contri-


bution of record" in the calendar year. Your contribution is recorded when it includes your name and/or envelope number. To ensure that your communion is recorded, please fill out the "Record of Communion and/or Prayer Request" card at least once a year. Communion cards can be found in the pew racks at the end of each pew. The card may also be used for prayer requests, address changes, questions, or comments. If you are worshiping exclusively from home, please contact Sonya Sowards with prayer requests and worship dates.

Donating Stock to St. John's

One of the many ways to financially support St. John's is through the donation of stock. Donating appreciated stock will benefit the church and provide a potential tax benefit to the donor. For stock that has been held for more than a year and has appreciated in value, one can take a charitable deduction based on the stock's fair market value on the day of donation. Additionally, making such a donation will avoid capital gains taxes on the increased value of the stock. Thrivent members are eligible to apply for two Action Team Grants each year to benefit their church. St. John's members Mike & Cathy Kahl routinely obtain grants for the church and have provided a helpful step-by-step guide:

- First, you must have a specific project in mind. You will also have to give an estimate of the number of people that might participate and when the project will be completed. The project should have something to do with bringing people into our organization or furthering our ministries.
- Once you have the above information, log in to your account at thrivent.com.
- Go to the bottom of the page to the Noah section. Click on Thrivent action teams.
- Choose "apply now" on the first page and then "apply now" again.
- On the next page, click "begin application." You have an option to get advertising materials and even T -shirts for your action team if you want them.
- The money arrives fairly quickly in the form of a Visa card. Use this card for purchases related to your project.
- When the project is finished, log in again and report that fact.
