Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope your progress on the daily Bible reading is going well! I have to confess, I'm a little behind at the moment, but I'm looking forward to being able to catch up in the next day or two. I've had a couple of people say to me that they're looking forward to the daily Bible readings, and I've heard a few more people say that they're reading some of the sections differently, especially the readings from Proverbs, which are usually a few verses at a time. That's completely okay—at some point, I'm going to sit down and just read through the entire book of Proverbs all at once. It's less important to read exactly the prescribed section on the specific day, and more important to work toward building that habit of daily time with Scripture.

But a very important mark of discipleship is the one that we're going to try in February: sharing the faith story with those outside the Church. I'm always going to remember an interaction that a classmate of mine had with one of our professors in seminary. My classmate had quoted the saying attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, "Preach the Gospel at all times. Use words when necessary," and my professor smiled and said, "yeah, but words are necessary a lot more often than you think." Which is true. In the book of Romans, St. Paul says, "But how are [people] to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him?" Paul wasn't writing that letter just to preachers or theologians or professional leaders in the church; he was writing it to all of the Christians in Rome. All of us—no matter what age, level of education, status, or anything else—all of us are called to share that Good News of what God has done for us.

Which I know isn't always the easiest thing to do; talking with people about faith can be a scary thing, especially since most of us don't do it very often. But the Holy Spirit will be there with you when you do it, and like any other skill, the more you practice it, the easier it will become. Before you can share the story of your faith with others, it can help to think through it for yourself. Think about times that you've seen God active in your life, and think about ways that you've been able to draw nearer to God. And at some point this month, find someone in your life who isn't part of a church, and invite them to come along to worship with you. I'd be willing to bet that once all is said and done, even if the person you invited doesn't join you for worship, that you'll have strengthened your relationship with that person, and become closer to them.

Sharing about your faith, and reaching out to other people in love and faith, is a huge part of living that life of faith that we're all called to live.

Meeting God in the Ordinary


WELCA Retreat

Thrivent Action Team Grants

Thrivent members are eligible to apply for two Action Team Grants each year to benefit their church. St. John's members Mike & Cathy Kahl routinely obtain grants for the church and have provided a helpful step-by-step guide:

First, you must have a specific project in mind. You will also have to give an estimate of the number of people that might participate and when the project will be completed. The project should have something to do with bringing people into our organization or furthering our ministries.

Once you have the above information, log in to your account at thrivent.com.

Go to the bottom of the page to the Noah section. Click on Thrivent action teams.

Choose "apply now" on the first page and then "apply now" again.

On the next page, click "begin application." You have an option to get advertising materials and even T-shirts for your action team if you want them

The money arrives fairly quickly in the form of a Visa card. Use this card for purchases related to your project.

When the project is finished, log in again and report that fact.

When submitting articles, please include <u>complete</u> information such as date, time, location, and how to sign up for events (including links and QR codes to forms). Images are welcome but should be photos taken around St. John's or posters created by the submitter—not stock images or any images downloaded from the Internet which St. John's is not licensed to use.
