Dear Friends in Christ.

One of the marks of discipleship that we're continuing to look at and talk about is weekly worship. Worship is an important part of the Christian life: it's where we gather, not only to praise God, but to join together as a community of faith, and be strengthened for the lives of love and service that we're called to live. The Lutheran confessions describe the Church as "the assembly of all believers among whom the Gospel is purely preached and the holy sacraments are administered according to the Gospel." The Church is community, gathered around Word and Sacrament, and part of living that life of faith is being part of that community, gathered to encounter God in worship, regularly.

It can be hard to make the time to gather for worship; with a million other things going on in everyone's life and in the world, it can be overwhelming trying to fit everything in. But I know that, speaking for myself, having the opportunity to be a part of a community of believers, and being able to be in worship and encounter God through worship, helps to ground me and strengthen me for the rest of the busy, overscheduled week. Even when I'm on vacation or taking time away from St. John's for continuing education, I do my best to find a church that I can worship with.

We're focusing on weekly worship attendance during March because, during March, we're going to have additional opportunities to gather in worship. In addition to the Saturday evening and Sunday morning services, St. John's is going to be a part of two Wednesday evening Lenten worship series, one with PACA and one with the Muhlenberg Parish. Each of those groups is hosting a series of worship services, and we're going to be a part of both of them. Our night to host overlaps for both of them, so that St. John's will be hosting PACA and the Muhlenberg Parish at the same time. The schedules are listed below:

Two women plus ten instruments equals one good time when Simple Gifts takes the stage at St. John's on March 16th, starting at 4:00 p.m. This award-winning band performs on an impressive array of instruments, including two violins, mandolin, hammered dulcimer, recorders, and guitar plus some more unusual instruments like the bowed psaltery, baritone fiddle, banjolin, guitjo, and doumbek.

Simple Gifts presents a wide variety of ethnic folk music, including everything from lively Irish jigs and down-home American reels to hard-driving Klezmer *freilachs*, haunting Gypsy melodies, and exotic Balkan dance tunes. Throughout their performances, they put their own distinctive stamp on traditional tunes, blending styles from diverse cultures with their American roots.

According to the Celtic Classic Festival in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, "few musicians can match the warmly personal stage presence Simple Gifts

possesses." It is obvious that these women love the music they play, and they know how to share their talents, their enthusiasm, and their sense of humor with the audience.

Caring for Creation Tackling Food Waste: A Path to a Greener Future What We Can Do at St. John's

Food waste is a pressing issue that affects our environment, economy, and society. When food ends up in landfills, it decomposes anaerobically (without oxygen), producing methane—a greenhouse gas that is 27 times more potent than carbon dioxide. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), food waste is the single most common material sent to landfills, comprising 24.1% of municipal solid waste. In fact, food waste is responsible for about 58% of methane emissions from landfills. Reducing food waste can help mitigate these emissions and contribute to a healthier planet.

The Benefits of Composting

Composting is a sustainable alternative to sending food waste to landfills. By composting, we can recycle organic materials into nutrient-rich soil amendments that benefit gardens, farms, and landscapes. Composting helps reduce the need for chemical fertilizers, conserves water, and improves soil health. It also reduces greenhouse gas emissions by diverting organic waste from landfills.

Take Action Today

Reducing food waste and promoting composting are crucial steps toward a more sustainable future. By making small changes in our daily lives, such as composting food scraps and supporting organizations that tackle food waste, we can make a significant impact on the environment.

Starting a composting project at home is a fantastic way to reduce food waste and create nutrient-rich compost for your garden. For detailed guidance, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has a helpful guide to composting at home (https://www.epa.gov/recycle/composting-home). If backyard composting isn't for you, there are some companies that have residential curbside pickup of food waste for composting (https://backtoearthcompost.com/). Alternatively, there are in-home composters that you can investigate to see if small machine like this would be a right fit for you.

Starting small and being consistent with your composting efforts can make a significant impact on reducing food waste. Happy composting!

Images are welcome but should be photos taken around St. John's or posters created by the submitter—not stock images or any images downloaded from the Internet which St. John's is not licensed to use.
