Dear Friends in Christ,

The school year is almost over, and we're preparing for graduation celebrations and getting ready for summer trips and activities. Even though the Sunday school year is winding down, there are still lots of things that St. John's is going to be involved in this summer! Space constraints mean that I can't list everything that St. John's is going to be involved in, but I'd love to highlight a few things.

First and foremost, we're going to continue gathering every Sunday for worship! The Augsburg Confession, one of the foundational Lutheran documents, describes the Church as "the community of believers, gathered around the Word of God rightly preached, and the Sacraments administered according to the Gospel." I'm excited to be a part of the community here at St. John's as we gather every Sunday around the Word and the Sacraments. In addition to our regular Sunday worship, we're also going to be celebrating our Confirmation students on May 31st, and welcoming new members on June 7th as well as celebrating at least one Holy Baptism, on June 21st. It's an exciting time to be able to welcome new members to the congregation!

June also means Vacation Bible School. This year we're going to be going on a Rainforest Adventure! We've already gotten a lot of students and volunteer leaders signed up to help, and I'm excited to be able to be a part of VBS. It's a great opportunity to share God's love with young people both in our congregation, and from all over Phoenixville and the surrounding area. ASP is a fantastic opportunity to serve our neighbors, as we work to make homes in West Virginia and other parts of Appalachia warmer, dryer, and safer. It's also a fantastic experience for all of the participants on the trip, as they grow in faith and get opportunities to practice serving their neighbors.

And finally, I'm excited for us to be able to support Bear Creek Camp this summer. Bear Creek is a Lutheran church camp located just outside of Wilkes-Barre, PA. The camp is affiliated with the Southeastern PA Synod. We've had a few campers attend for many years, but this year, we're going to be sending at least seven campers over the course of the summer (as well as Pastor Russ; I'll be volunteering as the camp chaplain for the week from June 28th to July 3rd!) Bear Creek is a wonderful camp, and I'm looking forward to being able to be a part of the camp experience this summer.

There are a lot of fun and exciting ways that we're going to get the opportunity in the coming months to love and serve both God and our neighbors, and I'm looking forward to being a part of them!

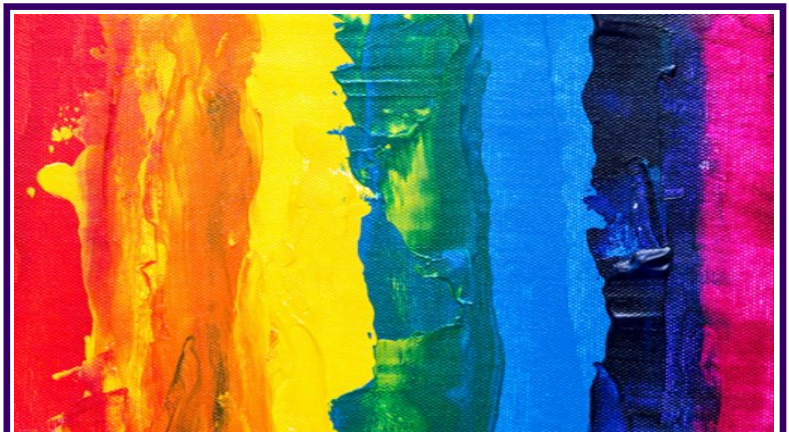

Prior Meeting Minutes

Motion by Mike, second by Marc to accept the minutes as written; motion carried.

Staff Reports

Committee Reports

Finance Committee meeting minutes of 3/23/26 – accepted as written.

- Benevolence Giving – the Pastor and Social Ministry Committee should work together to ensure the congregation knows what St. John's is supporting and that funds are paid out
- **Motion from Committee:** The finance committee recommends the current Undesignated Bequest Distribution policy be updated to reflect as follows: 10% shall go to Outreach (per St. John's Constitution), 10% to Scholarship, 10% to Circle of Life Endowment, 35% to Capital Improvements, and 35% to St. John's Investment Fund. Further, reasonable discretion shall be given to the Finance Committee, including but not limited to, in the case of an outsized bequest. (This applies to undesignated bequests from an estate, not funds donated in memory.) **Motion carried.**
- Recommendation on Campership Scholarship support – Finance Committee recommends that St. Johns encourage campers to apply for tuition-only scholarships and recommends scholarships to be awarded on a needs basis. Council discussed the various options to address. **Marc made a motion that for 2026, St. John's will reimburse 50% of the Tier A tuition cost for each camper; funding will come from the Scholarship Fund. Jim seconded the motion. Motion carried with one abstention.**

- **Kyle made a motion to accept Finance Committee minutes as presented, Marc seconded, motion carried.**

- Circle of Life Endowment Committee of 04/08/26 – accepted as written.
